

A COMPREHENSIVE APPROACH TO EMOTIONAL INTELLIGENCE: A THEORY IN RELATION TO ONLINE LEARNING

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ABSTRACT

This study examines how online learning in higher education has become a popular alternative to traditional education. It first gained popularity with working adults, but younger students are now capitalizing on this educational alternative, particularly in poorer urban areas, where the path to higher education includes working to sustain one self.
